

Cemetery Plans Progress

A public consultation exercise was undertaken in April to seek residents views on the proposed extension of the Thorpe Road Cemetery. There were a total of 792 questionnaires returned with 786 voting in favour of the extenison going ahead.

The cemetery extension is currently in the planning and design stage but the parish council will keep the public informed appropriately throughout the rest of the project. Cotsford Park Play Area New Play Area

It's been a busy 13 month for Cotsford Park Working Group but well worth it. The group made up of friends, family and residents began work in September 2013 to improve the dilapidated play area which lies within the centre of Cotsford Park Estate.

Giving up their own time the group have held numerous meetings and held consultation events involving schools, residents and most importantly local children. Children were given the opportunity to identify and select their preferred type of equipment and once this was



established a design was submitted. The new play area will cater for toddlers along with children of an older age and will also provide seating for adults supervising their little ones. Funding bids were submitted and the group managed to successfully raise $\pounds 54,000$ toward the

cost of the project. Work is scheduled to start on 1st December 2014 and due to be complete by the 19th giving the children a safe and fun play area which will be officially opened early 2015.

John Maudling, the Chairman of Cotsford Park Working Group said "I would just like to thank every member of our working group for all their hard work and effort. Without their sheer determination and dedication this result would not have been possible.

Horden Regeneration Partnership

Have you seen any of the new signage boards at Warren House Gill or visited the brilliant Horden Heritage Centre in the Welfare Park? I bet you didn't know that these are examples of recent and past projects worked up and influenced by the comments of members of Horden Regeneration Partnership?

The Horden Heritage Centre started as an idea from members of the group, and with support from partners, is now an excellent facility open each Wednesday and ran by volunteers. Partnership members have also been working with Durham County Council and Durham Heritage Coast staff over the last three years to advise on a variety of topics such as location and content of the seating and signage along our stretch of the Heritage Coast. This culminated in the creation of the 'Horden Walk' brochure which finishes the set for all the villages on the Durham Heritage Coast with a well attended and informative launch event held on 30th September 2014.

The Cotsford Park Play Area group mentioned above is another of our recently supported projects. Members discuss all kinds of things which are happening in the village and get updates from all sorts of groups. So if you are part of a group - community, sporting or business, we would welcome you coming along.

Are you excited about the opportunities, layout and planning of the new train station? Or would you like to be part of a group, working in partnership with Horden Parish Council, designing a new pavilion on Sunderland Road Playing Fields? These are just examples of two projects in the pipeline and something members of the group will be involved in. If this is something you would like to become involved in then please come along. Anyone living in the village or who works here for the benefit of the village is welcome. Our meetings are friendly and informal and they are held on a six to eight week cycle in the Social Welfare Centre. The next meeting is at **6pm on 9th December 2014**, so please come along or pass the message on.

Horden Denes

The third and final stage of the Heritage Lottery Funded project at Horden Denes is almost complete. The flooding under the bridge at Warren House now has new drainage to carry the water away from under the bridge and the car parking area around the bridge has also been improved and tidied up. A series of information panels have been placed around the reed beds and seating has been installed for those wanting to enjoy the views and tranquillity.

The road from Warren House to the cliff top now has a gate and the old flight road has been narrowed at the request of landowners and locals. Unfortunately, the area has been plagued by illegal use of 4 wheel drives, off-road bikes and fly tipping, this sort of activity not only destroys the protected rare grasslands but also rubbish from fly tipping often ends up on the beach banks, which is bad news for wildlife and isn't nice to look at. This behaviour by a few, spoils it for the rest of the walkers, bird watchers etc. who appreciate and treasure the area. The England Coast Path runs along the Durham Coast and visitor numbers are increasing, many have said how wonderful the area is and we hope to keep it that way.

The new seating on the cliff top replaces an old plastic bench that has long since gone. This new circular structure is made from stone and reflects the memories from those who know Horden the most. Timber end pieces designed by a local artist reflect the mining heritage of Horden, and we hope by situating the seating here visitors will enjoy the unbroken views both north and south. The butterfly wings represent the Speckled Wood butterfly often seen in the coastal denes and gills.

A new footpath runs from the top of Blackhills Gill, alongside the railway line and to the south of the reed beds eventually leading to the cliff top and the new seating. This new path provides different views for walkers and provides an alternative route from the Coastal Footpath.

The new Horden Village Walk leaflet takes us on a 4 mile walk from the village along the coast looking at points of interest along the way and a dedicated leaflet on Horden Denes show the new footpaths and artwork recently installed. Copies will be available from the Welfare Centre, Horden Library and other community buildings.
