Horden Staplyton Drive MUGA

Following Alexander Developments unfortunately going into administration, as per our update in the Autumn 2013

Newsletter the Parish Council and Durham County Council were receiving a number of complaints from local residents regarding the unsafe condition of the small play area within the estate. The Parish Council began working in partnership with Durham County Council's Sports and Leisure Service to improve and make the play area and facilities safe.

The Parish Council made enquiries to progress the transfer of the land in order for the essential works to be undertaken by Durham County Council. It was then discovered that all assets of Alexander Developments had been passed to the Crown and that the Treasury Solicitor intend to take over the ownership of the two areas (MUGA and play area).

The Parish Council continued to make enquiries with regard to the transfer of the land in question and were informed that the Duchy of Lancaster now have responsibility for the land and that any transfer would have to be at open market value.

This was considered by the Parish Council and at this time resources were not available to take on the ownership of the land and facilities. Therefore any enquiries relating to the land should be directed to Farrer & Co, who act on behalf of the Duchy of Lancaster. Their contact details are as follows:

Horden Housing - Accent Homes

Some of you may be aware from recent news that Accent Housing have taken the decision to dispose of their stock of empty properties and any future properties as they fall empty.

Accent is now seeking consent from the Homes and Communities Agency for a programme of disposals, they are hoping many of the homes will be purchased by would-be homeowners under a homesteading initiative, subject to approval by the Homes and Communities Agency.

A spokesperson from Accent said "please rest assured the offer of homes for £1 was for the County Council and other social housing providers. It **does not** apply to private or commercial buyers".

The Parish Council, although not responsible for housing, support any groups or initiatives that are working towards reaching a satisfactory resolution regarding the housing situation.

Horden Parish Council

As a Horden Parish Councillor and a keen genealogist, I thought it would be interesting to research the names on the Commonwealth War Grave Commission Cenotaph, in the Thorpe Road Cemetery. These servicemen were either killed in action or died from their wounds. It is also the 100th anniversary of the beginning of first World War and the 75th anniversary of the Second World War. Service men who died from 1914–1918 and 1939–1945 are buried in our closed cemetery at St. Mary's Church graveyard.

The final name I researched was a Thomas Williams, No. 46933, of the Kings Own Scottish Borderers, who died on the 28th October 1918, aged 36 years. I then discovered that my great aunt, Anne Rudkin had married his brother Mansfield Williams. Anne and Mansfield had a double wedding along with her brother, my Grandfather Richard Rudkin and grandmother Mary Elizabeth Copeland on the 25th December 1909 at St. Mary's Church, Easington Village.



Then this unbelievable family story started to unfold. I discovered a newspaper photograph, via the internet "SIX SON OF HORDEN PARENTS SERVING THE KING".

Further research uncovered their parents were Matthew Williams, born 3rd September 1855 in Usworth, Durham and Ann Richardson, born 1860 in Benton, Northumberland and were married 16th March 1868 in the Parish Church at Usworth, Durham. They had 12 children in total and on the 1911 census they lived at 42 First Street, Horden. Matthew died 4th July 1926, age 70 years and Ann died 1935 age 75 years.

Names of the six include Thomas Williams and the other five are as follows, three survived the war and three lost their lives:

John Williams, No. 18877 of the 7th Battalion Yorkshire Regiment died of wounds on the July 6th 1917, age 38 years. He is buried in Seaham Cemetery. John married Alice Heads on 24th May 1902 at St. John's Church, Seaham and they had 4 children. After John's death Alice married Frederick Levitt in 1919 and had 4 more children. Alice died in 1968 age 83 years.

Joseph Richardson Williams, No. S5399, served with the Royal Navy Rescue. Joseph married Elizabeth Moore in 1920 and had 6 children. Joseph died in 1964 age 68 years.

Stephen Williams, No. KP/648, served in the D.L.I. And Royal Navy. He married Florence Hill 15th July 1911 at the Register Office, Easington. They had 4 children and Stephen died 31st January 1940, age 48 years. Florence married in 1941 to Samuel Patterson, she died 1981 age 87 years.

Edward Williams, No. 14589, of the 7th Battalion Yorkshire Regiment, was killed in action on 1st February 1917, age 24 years. He is buried in the Combles Communal Cemetery Extension, France. I found no marriage for Edward.

James Williams, No. 15764, of the East Yorkshire Regiment. He enlisted on 11th November 1914 but was medically discharged 28th November 1914. James married Mary Fisher, and had 10 children. James died 1963 age 68 years and Mary died 1965 age 68 years.

There are still descendants of Matthew and Ann living in Horden today. Article by Councillor Edna Connor
