Horden Colliery Heritage Centre Grand Re-opening



Horden Colliery Heritage Centre has re-opened following a refurbishment of the two rooms now styled and dressed in the 1920's. The centre's committee was contacted by officials from Beamish Museum who suggested they

create the two themed rooms at the facility, the Committee then decided to create a 1920's living room and kitchen. The kitchen has a range that has been created by trainees from the Accent Organisation.

The new rooms were unveiled at an event that saw around 300 people visit the facility. People were so impressed that they were giving donations, that will go towards the running of the centre. The rooms were officially opened by one of the oldest people in Horden; Alderman Ada Nesbitt, who cut the ribbon. The Horden Colliery Heritage Centre is open to visitors each Wednesday from noon until 3pm.

Cemetery Facilities to Improve

Popular Park Eaterie to Re-Open

The Green Leaf Café, Horden Welfare Park's popular eaterie, is set to re-open. Now under new management, Haswell and District Mencap are opening for business on June 29th and have committed to providing users of Horden's largest recreational open space with value for money, tasty meals and snacks all year round.

Paul Davison, the Parish Council's Clerk said, "This venture represents a big commitment for both

Mencap and the parish council working together in order to provide a valuable service to the

community. The council are committed to providing training opportunities for local people and working in partnership with Mencap, to help those people with learning difficulties is an added bonus".

From freshly brewed coffee to a wide selection of homemade, fresh meals such as taty hash, stew and dumplings and lasagne to choose from, the café aims to cater for every taste.

The Café is open to suggestions so if there isn't something on the menu that you'd like to see on there, just pop in and let the staff know!

Thorpe Road Cemetery is to receive a facelift with its washroom facilities. The original toilet block, built in 1953 has recently been closed to the public due to the building requiring a major refurbishment and not being suitable for use any further.

Paul Davison, the Parish Council's Clerk said "the toilets are now in need of extensive repair, required to be made compliant with disability legislation and above all need to be pleasant and fit for public use. The time has come for the building to be renovated or replaced".

Work in the cemetery, which achieved a Green Flag award in 2011 at its first attempt, will commence in summer 2013, refurbishing the existing facilities to bring the toilets back into re-use. Work is also planned on resurfacing roadways into the cemetery which have suffered pothole and wear damage after a series of harsh winters.

St. Mary's Church Centenary Year 1913-2013

This year St Mary's celebrates 100 years of its mission and ministry in this village. The "Miners Cathedral" as it is locally called, was first opened and consecrated by the Bishop of Jarrow on the 26th April 1913.

The 26th April 2013 saw in the 100th Anniversary of Dedication, with a splendid service being held at St. Mary's. The Right Revd & Rt Hon Dr. David Hope KVCO, the former Archbishop of York officiated over the proceedings and the Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving was accompanied with an emotional performance from the Girl Choristers of Durham Cathedral.

Afterwards, a reception was held at the Social Welfare Centre and you may have been one of the lucky ones to purchase a beautiful signed print of St. Mary's Church!

Thursday $27^{th} - 30^{th}$ June sees the continuance of the festivities with the Centenary Flower Festival . Children from Horden's schools will be creating artwork and will display these at the festival in St. Mary's church to accompany the flower displays and for those who need refreshment, a cake stall with soft drinks will also be provided.

On the 30th June, there will be the Ordination of James Leigh as Deacon in Durham Cathedral at 10 am and a welcome Mass by Father Leigh as the Curate of St. Mary's at 6 pm. This will be followed by a reception in Horden Social Welfare Centre shortly after.

Further celebrations are planned on Sunday the 27th October with the Centenary Gala Concert with Guest Appearance of the world famous baritone, Seaham born, Sir Thomas Allen at St. Mary's. On Friday 8th November there will be a Centenary Dinner held, with forthcoming details expected.

Culminating in the year, the expected refurbishment of the church hall will be completed. Horden's Church Hall which is located behind the church was built in 1904 as the original parish church dedicated to St Hilda, a great northern English Saint along with Cuthbert, Chad, Aidan of Lindisfarne and many more until St Mary's Church was built. The hall committee has managed to secure a grant of £500,000.00 from Big Lottery in order to re-furbish the hall. Work is already well underway with a local builder and is due to be completed on 23rd September 2013. When the work is complete, the hall will be opened and re-named The Horden Centennial Centre.
