Accent Foundation - Investing In Horden



Accent Foundation manages over 300 homes in Horden and as part of a major investment programme is spending £15 million on improving its resident's homes and communities in Horden, Easington and Blackhall.

Over 550 homes are due to be improved over the next three years in Blackhall, Horden and Easington. The work includes fitting new bathrooms, kitchens, windows, doors and in some areas, home extensions and new roofs (Horden Bungalows)

We were delighted that Horden Parish Council could join us in November to celebrate the first completions in phase 1 of the programme which will see 84 bungalows in total improved in Horden, No.49 Northumberland Avenue was officially opened by Accent resident and Horden Parish Councillor Billy Hill.

The Principle contractor for this project is Bullocks. They are a national company with a County Durham base and they will be offering job opportunities for local people throughout the duration of our 3 year contract.

Residents have been consulted about the improvements and have helped to prioritise some of the work that will be done including colours and styles of some of their new fixtures and fittings.

The investment is part of Accent's wider efforts to work in partnership with those community groups and residents dedicated to making Horden a great place to live including Horden Parish Council.

Accent Community Organiser Michael Fishwick, a former Manager of Horden Regeneration Partnership, is working on a range of projects and initiatives, supporting the regeneration of the area including new residents support services, community events, environmental improvements and if lottery funding can be secured, plans to refurbish St. Mary's Community Hall, as a centre for regeneration.

Michael says "we are committed to making Horden a great place to live—it's a village which is steadily improving because of it's strong sense of community and location on the Durham Heritage Coast. Tackling some of the deep rooted problems associated with deprivation needs a community-wide effort and Accent is happy to be part of the good things happening in Horden.

Big Garden Bird Watch weekend 28-29 January 2012

One of the biggest events of the year is set to take place over the weekend of 28th-29th January 2012, but it's nothing to do with MPs, celebrities or sport. This event involves our feathered friends, over half a million people and plenty of cups of tea!.

Yes it's almost time for the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch. This is the charity's most important event of the year when people across the UK look out of their window and spend an hour of their weekend recording how many birds they see.

Last year, over 600,000 people counted more than 10 million garden birds. The information from this survey helps the RSPB form a comprehensive picture of how well (or not so well), each species is doing.

Taking part in Big Garden Birdwatch not only helps the RSPB track the ups and downs of garden birds, but gives you the perfect excuse to sit down with a cup of tea and enjoy the wildlife in your garden.

School children and their teachers are also being given the opportunity to learn more about their local birds with the Big School's Birdwatch taking place 16th until 30th January 2012. IT'S IN THE NEWS - GET READY FOR SEPTEMBER SWITCH



From September 12 next year, the biggest change to hit our TV screens since the launch of colour television comes to our region when 1.4 millio households in the North East go completely digital.

Analogue signals will be turned off and Freeview coverage boosted to reach virtually all homes, including thousands served by local relay transmitte who will be able to receive digital TV free via an aerial for the first time.

"Switchover affects every viewer who watches TV using an aerial," says DigitalUK Regional Manager John Askew. "All Freeview, TopUp TV and BT Vision televisions, glighal recorders and set-top boxes will have to be returned at both stages of the switchover in order to receive all the new signals – so everyone needs to know the switchover dates and what to do when It happers?
